Development Issue 1-1  Response to the Humanitarian Crisis	[Current Situation and Challenges] Since January 2015, more than ten years of conflict have destroyed basic infrastructure, impoverishing the lives of the population, and the economic crisis has hampered the government's provision of basic administrative services. The UN Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) for Yemen 2025 identifies 19.5 million people as those in need of assistance which is more than half of the population. In recent years, the gap between humanitarian needs and funds has been further exacerbating and, according to the OCHA, only 768 million USD (28% of the required funds of 2.71 billion USD) was provided in 2024. In light of the vast humanitarian needs in Yemen, the United Nations and concerned countries are stressing the importance of support from the international community.					[Strategy] Providing humanitarian and development assistance which contribute to economic recovery and nation building in a wide range of fields including food security, health, education and WASH in cooperation with international organizations working in Yemen.
